Online Entry Registration Instructions

PLEASE READ complete rules, division and class descriptions, and entry information in this Prospectus **BEFORE** going to Online Entry Registration.

Submit entry information online *before* bringing items to the Fair.

Be sure your school is set up with the Fair's Competitive Exhibits Office PRIOR to Entry Registration:

- 1) Go to the [Jr./Sr. High School Art Show](#) on the Competitive Exhibits web page.
- 2) Click the **ONLINE ENTRY REGISTRATION** button (*available May 1 – May 29*)
- 3) Click **Login/Logoff**
- 4) Choose **Type: School** or **Quick Group** and follow the instructions.
PLEASE NOTE: Teachers may use **School** login and password from last year. **However**, if there are multiple teachers at your school accessing online entry registration, we ask that **each teacher** create their own **Quick Group** and password. Use the teacher's full name (first and last) for **Group User Name**.
- 5) Click **Begin adding Exhibitors and their Entries**. Enter Exhibitor's (student's) information. *Use the School or Quick Group password when inputting each student's information.*
- 6) Click **Continue** to go to **Create Entries**.
For each entry:
 - Select a **Department** ex.: Jr/Sr High Art Show
 - Select a **Division** ex.: Jr/Sr Drawing
 - Select a **Class** ex.: class 01 - Chalk Pastel
 - Fill in all requested information for the class you are entering.
ex.: **Title:** *Water Lily*
Description: *blue flower on black paper, blue mat, frame with glass, 11"x14"*
- 7) When each Exhibitor's entry information is complete, click **Continue**. You may now **Add Entries for a different Exhibitor** or **Check Out**.
(**NOTE:** If you think you may want to modify your entries, you may save your current session and check out at a later session. **Be sure to Check Out before the closing date listed; entries are not submitted to the Fair office until the check-out process is complete.**)
- 8) When all Exhibitor entry registrations are complete, follow instructions to **Check Out**. Fill in "yes" to agree to all the terms and conditions of entry as defined in the Premium List and click **Submit**.
- 9) After you **Finish**, please go to **Account Summary** and print a **Packing List** to bring with your entries on take-in day.

KORUM FAMILY ARTS SCHOLARSHIP COMPETITION

Held in conjunction with the Jr/Sr High School Art Show, this special competition is only **open to high school juniors** (2013-2014 school year.)

Entries should showcase the uniqueness of Washington state - share what makes Washington special to you. One entry per student.

Student may either:

A) enter an additional piece for the Korum competition or

B) enter the same piece in both Korum AND Jr/Sr High School Art Show

A separate entry form is required in addition to regular online registration. Click the button ---> for scholarship information and form.

JR/SR HIGH SCHOOL ART SHOW ENTRY GUIDELINES

- All work must be done exclusively by the student entrant, grade 6-12, within the current school year.
- **Please limit work to one piece per student, per teacher (the only exception is the Korum Scholarship, above). Work must be done in that teacher's class.**
- Register entries online for each piece of artwork (see instructions, page 1). We cannot guarantee against spelling errors. Please type carefully when registering entries online; this is the source for both display tags and catalog.
- Each piece must be labeled on the back with student's name and the title of the piece.
- Label portfolios and folders with School name for Drop-Off/Take-In. All packing materials should be labeled for return to the school.
- All work must stay in the show the full run of the Fair, September 5-21, 2014.
- Entries cannot be accepted or returned by mail or common carrier.
- **All work must be titled!** "Untitled" is not allowed as a title in the show. Untitled work will be rejected. We encourage that titles should be unique and individual, and please keep them short.
- All work must be suitably matted and ready to hang. Frames are not required. Work not properly assembled or that becomes disassembled during hanging will not be displayed. All works should be matted as one individual unit.

- Limit size of work to 18"x 24" or equivalent square inches, **including frame**. Frames with glass should be no larger than 11"x 14". Anything larger will not be accepted at the discretion of show management.
- All framed work needs to have appropriate hanging hardware.
- **3D work must be ready to hang!** Works such as masks, ceramics, mobiles and collages must have hangers attached and a hiding spot for Entry Form. All new 3D considerations will be discussed by review during take in. Please contact well in advance for consent.
- Any work deemed too heavy for safe display will not be accepted, at the discretion of show management.
- All pencil, charcoal, chalk and pastels must be fixed or sealed. Areas may be available for spraying during take in. All work should be dry for gallery display.
- Although every precaution will be made to protect the art pieces, the Washington State Fair will not be responsible for theft, loss or damage to entries.
- The Fair reserves the right to reject any work it finds objectionable.

JUDGING & AWARDS

The Fair wishes to recognize the effort our region's young artists put into their work. Toward that end, the Jr/Sr High School Art Show's judging and award structure is being changed. The goal of these changes is to encourage:

- overall program participation
- quality of work
- a diverse representation of the region's student artwork

JUDGING AND RIBBONS

Artwork will be evaluated within each division and class, and judged on the following criteria:

- use of medium
- originality / creativity
- composition / design
- technical / craftsmanship

Professional artists will jury the open class entries and also select the placing for each class and the best of show for each division.

Each class will have a first, second, third and honorable mention placing/ribbon. There will also be a Best of Show rosette award for each division and age group.

Up to 10 special rosettes will be awarded for Most Patriotic art piece.

Fair guests will award the daily People's Choice ribbon through ballots. Ribbons will be awarded for daily People's Choice and Overall People's Choice.

PARTICIPATION PREMIUMS

To encourage a diverse field of competition, participating schools and homeschool groups will have the opportunity to win cash premiums.

Middle, Junior and High Schools:

Participation premiums will be awarded based on minimum participation requirements, and evaluated on: number of students in the school, distance from the Fair, number of entries submitted, and placings awarded. An art teacher (program coordinator) will be eligible for a \$100 cash premium, to be used for the arts at their school, based on participation and award points (limit one cash premium per teacher). Total school enrollment size must be provided in order to be considered for premiums.

Homeschools:

The top two individual homeschool students with the highest placing and judges score overall in the competition will receive \$50 each for their participation.

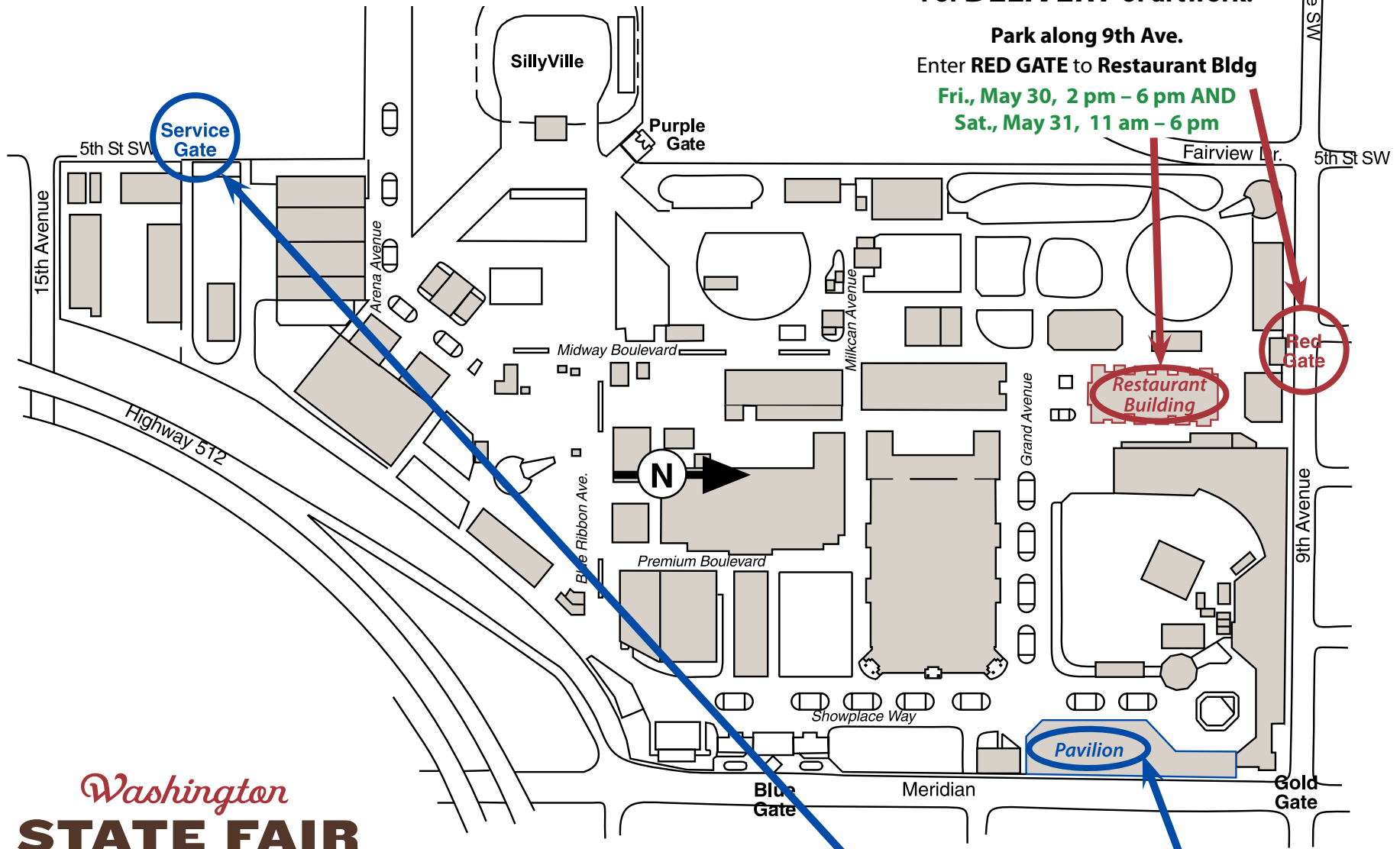
